LEADERSHIP TRAINING WORKSHOPS

Participants came from the Pine Barrens of Southern Jersey and from the Mountains of the Catskills. They were Peace Corps workers, Head Start Leaders, ministers, social workers, lawyers, ex-inmates, homeless shelter residents and a poet.

The program was a grand success, with 24 participating in the Basic Workshop on the weekend of May 31 to June 2 and 12 completing the training for Trainers Workshop on June 14 to 16.

High points includes a poem by Ruby Reeves in the Basic (see Meeting the Challenge) and Anna Lamp's Trust Leap in the Training for Trainers (she trusted one of the tables at Purchase Meeting which now has a ventilated design.)

Friends Meetings in the area provided their best Quaker cooking for the participants including help from Croton Valley, Purchase, Stamford-Greenwich and Wilton Meetings.

The leadership team for the basic included Charlie Spain, Anna Lamp and Jane Shapiro. For the Training for Trainers, the leaders were Joan DiBlasi, Fred Feucht and Anna Lamp.

Imagine, spending a weekend with other AVP leaders from all over New York State, sharing the joys, the humor and the problems of being a workshop leader. The two day program will include new exercises, reports from past workshops and planning for the future. More details about the location and agenda will be available soon.

DIVISION FOR YOUTH STAFF TRAINING WORKSHOPS

The New York State Division for Youth operates seven homes for youthful offenders in Westchester and nassau Counties. They have heare about the Alternatives to Violence Training and believe it would be helpful for their child care workers and fieldwork staff. One of their staff attended the recent AVP Workshop at Purchase and was very enthusiastic about the results.

The program would include the Basic, three day workshop with two follow up days, one and two months after the Basic. The follow up sessions would focus on sharing problems and discussing results of the AVP method. The workshop sessions will be held on weekdays from 10:00AM to 6:00PM. The Division for Youth staff consists of about 100 employees, so that a series of five workshops will be required.

Since the State AVP Program is only able to fund prison workshops, a special grant is being requested from the Hudson River Presbytery to fund this program. Two planning sessions have been held between the Division for Youth, the Hudson River Presbytery and AVP to discuss scheduling, funding, leadership, voluntary participation and other matters. WESTCHESTER FORENSIC UNIT STAFF TRAINING WORKSHOP

The Forensic Unit serves as the psychiatric ward of the Westchester County Jail. They work with emotionally disturbed inmates and also conduct "outpatient" programs for inmates in the Jail and Penetentiary. This includes counseling and groups for alcohol and drug abuse. The staff or 40 psychiatric nurses sometimes encounters conflicts with correctional officers, inmates and other staff members. They believe that the AVP training may help them to deal with these conflicts in a better way. If you are intrested in helping to lead this program, please contact Fred Feucht.

HELP FOR ANNA LAMP

Anna Lamp has been responsible for much of the success of the AVP Program at Sing Sing. Last year, Anna led twelve workshops and she has been one of AVP's most active lead trainers. Unfortunately, the health of Anna's mother has deteriorated and it has been necessary for Anna to stay at home and care for her mother. Without Anna's leadership this year, the workshops at Sing Sing have suffered.

Help has come in two forms. First, Pat Tappan made it possible to lead the two Leadership Training Workshops at Purchase in June by staying with Anna's mother during the workshops. Thanks for your valuable contribution to the AVP Program, Pat.

Secondly, Housitonic Friends Meeting has generously given AVP a grant of \$400.00. This is to be used to pay for care for Anna's mother while Anna leads prison workshops. This grant should enable Anna to lead at least two workshops. 
