

# IMAGING THE FUTURE OF AVP WORKSHOP IN ALBANY

A dozen AVP leaders met in Albany on December 13 to visualize the kind of work AVP will be doing in the year 2,000. Many images emerged about an organization that was working across the country and around the world, not just in New York State. An organization that is helping to resolve conflicts within the family and the community and even among nations, not just working in prisons. Images emerged about continuing support programs for inmates, youth and families, not just three day workshops.

Those that attended the all day workshop enjoyed learning the imaging process and found sharing their visions of the future exciting and exhilarating. In the workshop, participants decide that they wanted to conduct imaging workshops in each area council as the next step.

#### MEDIATION LEADERS TRAINING

Many AVP leaders may be interested in the Mediation Process as a conflict resolution technique. One of our AVP leaders, Chris Owens, is also the fulltime director of the highly successful, Westchester Mediation Center in Yonkers.

If you would like to become a mediator, there will be a Mediation Training Program offered in January and February led by Chris Owens.

The training program will involve three evening sessions and one Saturday session. The sessions are scheduled for January 21, 28 and 31 and February 4.

Successful completion of this training together with a period of supervision and evaluation will authorize volunteers to work within the N.Y.S Office of Court Administration Community Dispute Resolution Center Program. Volunteers are asked to make a commitment of two evenings or afternoons per month for a one year period following their training. There is a \$25.00 materials fee for trainees. The fee covers refreshments and supplies. Please contact Christopher Owens at the number listed in the AVP Directory if you are interested.

### AVP GOALS FOR 1987

At the December Statewide Council Meeting in Albany, the following nineteen goals were established for 1987. We hope to achieve these goals by the next Annual Meeting in September.

- 1. Revise Second Level Manual
- 2. Prepare a Training for Trainers Manual
- Develop a workshop in the area of sexuality (including sexism)
- Obtain a computer and printer for use of the Education Committee
- Establish a process for the Education Committee to communicate with and receive feedback from AVP Members regarding educational materials
- Do one community workshop with families of inmates
- 7. Establish a support group for AVP graduates who are released from prison and obtain approval for these meetings from the Board of Parole
- Conduct AVP training in at least three new states, when requested
- Develop a core of trainers in the Rochester-Buffalo area
- Start workshops for prisoners in New Jersey

- 11. Develop a video on AVP for fund raising, recruiting and public relations
- 12. Establish a Public Relations Committee for AVP
- 13. Translate the Basic manual into Spanish
- Explore and evaluate alternate workshop formats
- 15. Do four workshops for different segments of the community other than prisons and leadership training
- 16. Hold two workshops for in-service training of AVP facilitators
- 17. Send AVP leaders to at least one national workshop
- 18. Recruit more volunteers for the Financial Development Committee
- Publish a complete list of AVP outside facilitators

In addition, the Statewide Council set a goal of 150 workshops in 1987 based on the goals established by each area council This is a 20 percent increase over 1986.
