#### AVP SETS RECORD

In 1987, there were 150 AVP workshops conducted for community groups and in prisons. This is a 25 percent increase over 1986!

#### LEADERSHIP TRAINING WORKSHOPS

In order to make the concepts of Alternatives to Violence available to more people, a goal og 35 new outside trainers in 1988 was set by the Annual Meeting in September. So far, only about 10 outside leaders have completed the training.

To help to meet this goal, two Leadership Training Workshops will be offered this Spring in Westchester County. The Basic will be held on the weekend of May 20 to 22 and the Training for Trainers will be held four weeks later on June 17 to 19. Both workshops will be held in Purchase Friends Meetinghouse in suburban Westchester. These workshops are sponsored jointly by the Metropolitan and Westchester Fairfield-Area Councils.

We need to fill both workshops to meet our goals. Please talk to your friends, tell them about the benefits of the AVP program and encourage them to register.

#### AVP WORKSHOPS FOR SPOUSE ABUSERS

A special AVP program for inmates who have abused their wives or girlfirends has been proposed by Chris Owens. Chris has experience in leading many workshops for spouse abusers in the community and has found that they were quite successiful in reducing domestic violence. The workshops used a combination of small group discussions, films and role plays to confront the problem. The workshops were held in six weekly two hour sessions covering the following areas:

- 1. Community Building
- 2. Acknowledgement of Problem
- 3. Family Structure and Pathology
- 4. Conflict Resolution Skills
- 5. Assertiveness Training.

Each workshop was led by a man and woman team and the teams were supported by a clinical supervision session once a week.

A preliminary discussion of the program was held with Tony Clark of Sing Sing and he expressed interest in having ithis type of a workshop in the Network Unit

The Statewide Council of AVP felt that this proposal was related to AVP goals and should support the AVP philosophy. Transforming Power should be included as part of the program if it is sponsored by AVP. The Education Committee was asked to consider the project.

A NEW EXERCISE

Purpose: A trust exercise designed for participants to experience both trust and powerlessness on the one hand as well as power and a sense of responsibility on the other.

For the Training for Trainers Workshop this exercise focuses on giving clear and precise instructions to participants and is a good kinetic metaphor for the role of trainers.

Time: About 20 to 30 minutes.

Materials: Blindfold and paper.

Scenario: An airliner is in trouble and the pilot is blind. The air traffic controller must instruct the pilot how to avoid obstacles and land the airliner. All participants, other than the pilot and the controller are passengers. If the pilot hits an obstacle, the airliner crashes and all passengers are killed.

Sequence: Explain scenario and ask for volunteers for the pilot and air traffic controller. Take the pilot out of the room and blindfold him or her. Then crumple up eight to ten pieces of paper and place then on the floor in a random

pattern. Do not let the pilot see the pattern before he or she is blindfolded.

The air traffic controller is placed at the opposite end of the room from the door. Lead the pilot into the room and ask him to follow the instructions of the air traffic controller precisely. The controller tells the pilot exactly where to place his feet so that he can avoid obstacles and get through to the controller. The pilot can ask questions of the controller.

After one pair either lands or crashes, ask for two more volunteers. Repeat for three of four sequences as time allows.

Process exercise focusing on feelings of trust, powerlessness and the importance of accurate instructions.

This exersise was introduced by William Carrouthers, an inmate participant at a recent Training for Trainers Workshop at Sing Sing and the exercise is from an acting class. The group found the exercise challenging and a good learning experience. It seems especially appropriate for a Training for Trainers Workshop.

# BETTER AREA COUNCIL MEETINGS RESULTS OF OUESTIONNAIRE

The following ideas were preferred in the questionnaire on area council meetings: Things that would make area council

meetings more interesting were:

- More personal sharing of workshop experiences
- More practice in leading exercises.

Topics that were of interest are:

- 1. Leadership skills techniques.
- Conflict resolution in the family.
- Social problems and causes of violence such as: poor education, abused children, teenage mothers, unemployment etc.

Other things I would like are:

- Mini-workshops on Saturday to learn new exercises.
- A training skills day where trainers can practice leading new exercises.

Perhaps area councils can incorporate some of these ideas into their meetings. Ten members responded to the questionnaire.


